Just For Dogs

DogZone day care for dogs is where you can book your dog in on a casual basis or take out a 10 or 20 day pass which can be used over a 3 or 4 month period respectively. DogZone also offers a V. I. P. monthly pass for those dogs who need to come daily. Dogs on passes get priority bookings for day-care and grooming. All DogZone dogs are given a maintenance brush before going home to help maintain their coats condition minimising the amount of hair loss at home.

All you'll need to do is take your dog home, feed and love it. Exercise, play, daytime companionship and brushing will have already taken place. DogZone is based at 53-55 North St Richmond and is owned and managed by professional dog trainer Sally Chan.

15 inch x 11 inch

Bake in a slow oven for 140 for 40 mins.

Wait until cool ..and cut into small treats.

These can be placed in small plastic bags..

They can be frozen and take out the night before training...

All at C.D.T.S. especially our demo team, wish to extend their deepest sympathy to Piotr and family.

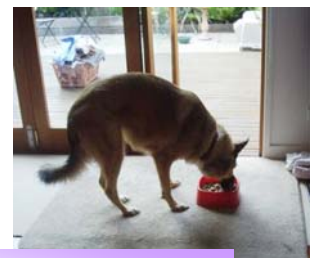
