Training Tips

To achieve success in your course, training should be carried out each day for 5 to 10 minutes, apart from your dogs regular walk.

It is also important to exercise and train your dog in different areas.

In this manner your dog learns to behave everywhere To simply train him in the backyard will ensure a very unruly dog everywhere including class.

Other training problems will develop when one person attends class each week with the dog, yet another member of the family carries out the practice at home.

This can be clearly seen by the instructor as the attendee always lacks proficiency in all exercises taught.

So always remember 10 minutes of training daily in a variety of areas and by the same handler attending each week, will lead to a proficient standard of training at the conclusion of your course.

Chicken and Oat treats

500 gms chicken mince
1 cup of plain wholemeal flour
2 Eggs
100 gms parmesan cheese.



Mix all ingredients and place on a well greased tray 11 inch x 8 inch

Press down well, this should cover the tray, with a thin layer of the mixture

Bake in a slow oven 140 for 40 mins.

Wait until cool, and cut into small treats.

These can be placed in small plastic bags..

They can be frozen and taken out the night before training...

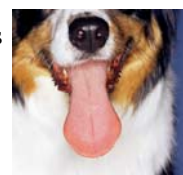

Chicken Soup

We all love soup in winter, so why not soup for our best friend.

This is a bit favourite with our dogs.

3 sticks of celery cut into small pieces
3 grated carrots
1 cup grated pumpkin
1/4 cup rice
5 cups of water
3 chicken thighs



Place all ingredients into a large pot, bring to the boil and slowly simmer for 2 hours.

Wait until cool, remove the chicken from the bones, break up into pieces, disregard bones, and return chicken pieces to your soup.

This lasts my dogs for a week, I heat it so it is just warm, can also be frozen.

A tip

When I make soup for us, I save all the skins from the carrots and pumpkin and add them to the dogs soup... Also the outside stalks from the celery goes into the dogs soup...
