I have done two recipe's this month

Chicken & Carrot Biscuits

Makes app: 100

This recipe is fast, simple and my dogs love them.

220 g plain wholemeal flour
220 g chicken mince
90-100 ml water
1/4 cup grated carrot
Preheat oven to 180

Mix flour and chicken mince together, add enough water to form a soft dough. Turn out onto a floured surface and roll to approximately 1/4 inch thick.

I cut into very small squares, and bake in an oven until golden brown about 15 -20 mins.

Allow to cool and store in an airtight container

Liver Treats

Slice lambs fry into half inch slices and place on a lightly greased tray slightly apart

Cook in a moderate oven 180 for 25-30 mins
Remove from oven and leave to cool on the baking tray

When cool cut into training size pieces

Place small amounts in plastic bags

These can be frozen

Just take a bag out the night before training

One lambs fry will give me a months training treats.

Total cost \$1.50
